## DETECTIVE SUPERINTENDENT'S EYES ONLY

You are going to set up a room separate from where the party will take place. Put items around the room that the guest investigators will discover and describe as they fill in their notes. Have some fun leaving out things such as a red ribbon, a pair of glasses, and a toothbrush, things that fit the descriptions on the list. The filled in blanks below will give you more ideas. To make the game more challenging (and I think more fun) also place items in the room that come close to the description, but don't quite fit. For example, for #1 have a long, red ribbon, but also a red bow and/or a red box. For what you wear to the grocery store, you could have a t-shirt and shorts, but you might also have a nightgown and/or bathing suit. Have fun.

1. What in the room is red and long? red ribbon
2. What in the room can be eaten? A box of bird seed or a can of cat food
3. What in the room can be laid on? A bed (if there is one) or the floor
4. What in the room has a pleasant smell? A bottle of cologne
5. What in the room could be in your backpack if you were going to school? A homework assignment
6. What in the room has at least 200 parts? A book with more than 200 pages
7. What in the room can someone hide behind? A chair or the drapes
8. What in the room could you wear to the grocery store? A t-shirt and shorts
9. What three things in the room could help a person see? A pair of glasses, a magnifying glass, a lamp (or the overhead light)
10. What in the room would you need for a trip to the Arctic? A toothbrush (no matter where you go, you will need to brush your teeth.)
11. What in the room makes a musical sound? A bell or an i-pod
12. What in the room begins with the letter "L"? a letter to a friend typed or hand-written
13. What 4 things in the room begin with the letter "W"? 4 walls
14. What in the room is blue-and-white? The Flag of Scotland, St. Andrew's Cross (That would be my suggestion, but I'm partial to Scotland.)
